CHANGES IN SERVICES DUE TO COVID-19

The safety and wellbeing of our employees and those we serve is our number one priority. We are taking the following precautions at our locations based on the recommendations of the CDC and Arizona Department of Health Services.

ADVS Headquarters

Our headquarters building is closed to the public. All services are still operational and employees are working remotely. **Main number:** 602-255-3373

Arizona State Veteran Homes

We are asking all non-essential visitors to avoid coming to the building unless absolutely necessary, and are actively screening all individuals—including staff—who enter. Only with prior approval, families and friends who need to visit a resident for critical or time sensitive reasons (hospice-related, medical authorizations, etc.) can visit the home. The administration buildings at all AVMCs are closed. Cemetery operations are still ongoing, but are limited to direct interments of caskets and cremated remains. Some committal services are scheduled.
