Bills Impacting Veterans/Military

Senate Bills

[SB 1003 auto title loans; clear title](#)

Prohibits a seller, bailor, lender or lessor from entering into a secondary motor vehicle finance transaction unless the borrower holds a clear title to the motor vehicle that the borrower uses to secure the loan.

Primary Sponsor(s): Sen. David Farnsworth, R-Dist. 16

Major Actions: 13 Jan 2020- - First Read and assigned to the Senate Finance and Rules Committees.

[SB 1004 interest rates; auto title loans](#)

Places a cap on a secondary motor vehicle finance contract at an annual interest rate between 24% and 36%, depending on the amount borrowed.

Primary Sponsor(s): Sen. David Farnsworth, R-Dist. 16

Major Actions: 13 Jan 2020- - First Read and assigned to the Senate Finance and Rules Committees.

[SB 1005 auto title loans; interest rate](#)

Places a cap on a secondary motor vehicle finance contract at an annual interest rate of 36%.

Major Actions: 13 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Finance and Rules Committees.

[SB 1018 bingo; licenses; taxes](#)

Eliminates the three classes of bingo licenses currently in use, replacing them with a single license for all bingo operations and raises the number days per week that a licensed operation can host bingo from five to seven.

Major Actions: 13 Jan 2020- - First Read and assigned to the Senate Finance and Rules Committees. **FAILED to pass the Senate Finance Committee with a vote of 5-5-0-0.**

[SB 1022 technical correction; veterans; conservatorship](#)

Makes technical corrections. Subject to a Strike- Everything Amendment pertaining to executive clemency; recertification process.

NOTE: The language for the Strike-Everything Amendment is not yet posted; however, my understanding is that the language will not pertain to veterans.

[SB1044 veterans' services; benefits counselors appropriation](#)

As passed the Senate, appropriates \$474,200 from the State General Fund in FY21 to the Arizona Department of Veterans' Services to hire six additional veteran benefits counselors. At least two of the additional benefits counselors must be placed in Apache, Coconino or Navajo County.

Transmitted to the House.**

[SB1112 veterans' home facility; Mohave county](#)

As passed the Senate, appropriates \$19,000,000 from the State General Fund in FY2021 to the Arizona Department of Veterans' Services (ADVS) to construct and establish a veterans' home facility in Mohave county. The appropriation is intended to be this state's share of the costs and is not subject to expenditure for any purpose unless ADVS has irrevocable commitments from the United States government to fund at least 65% of the total costs. Contains an Emergency Clause.

Major Actions: 13 Jan 2020- - First Read and assigned to the Senate Appropriations and Rules Committees. 21 Jan 2020- Received a "Do Pass as Amended" from the Senate Appropriations Committee with a vote of 9-0-0. 27 Jan 2020- Passed Senate Rules Committee. 28 Jan 2020- Passed Senate Democrat and Republican Caucus. 30 Jan 2020- Received a "Do Pass as Amended" by the Senate Committee of the Whole. **3 Feb 2020- Passed Senate Third Read with a vote of 27-2-1-0. 3 Feb 2020- Transmitted to the House.**

SB 1115 veterans overseas conflicts plates

Establishes the Veterans of Overseas Conflicts special plates if by December 31, 2020, a person pays \$32,000 to the Arizona Department of Transportation for implementation. Additionally, establishes the Veterans of Overseas Conflicts Special Plates Fund consisting of donations from the Veterans of Overseas Conflicts Special Plates. Monies from the fund shall be annually allocated to a Veterans of Foreign Wars entity located in this state, for the purposes of training and paying persons throughout this state where needed to process veterans' claims for service-connected disabilities and illnesses.

Major Actions: 13 Jan 2020 - First Read and assigned to the Senate Transportation & Public Safety and Rules Committees. 29 Jan 2020- Received a "Do Pass" from the Senate Transportation & Public Safety Committee with a vote of 7-0-1-0. 3 Feb 2020- Passed Senate Rules Committee. 4 Feb 2020- Passed Senate Democrat and Republican Caucus. **6 Feb 2020- Passed Senate Third Read with a vote of 28-1-1-0. Transmitted to the House.**

SB 1173 appropriation; emergency shelter; transitional housing

Appropriates \$450,000 from the state General Fund (state GF) in FY 2021 to the Department of Economic Security (DES) to distribute to the City of Cottonwood to develop a program for temporary emergency shelter and transitional housing services.

Major Actions: 21 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the House Appropriations and Rules Committees. 28 Jan 2020- Received a "Do Pass" recommendation from the House Appropriation Committee with a vote of 6-2-1-0. 03 Feb 2020- Passed Senate Rules. **4 Feb 2020- Passed Senate Democrat and Republican Caucus.**

SB 1178 Ganado center building; appropriation

Appropriates \$976,300 from the State General Fund in FY21 to the Arizona Department of Housing to distribute to the Navajo Nation for costs associated with designing and constructing the Ganado veterans' and senior citizens' center building.

Primary Sponsor(s): Sen. Jamescita Peshlakai, D-Dist. 7

Major Actions: 22 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Appropriations and Rules Committees.

[SB 1181 Fort Defiance veterans cemetery; appropriation](#)

Appropriates \$30,000 from the State General Fund in FY21 to the Arizona Department of Veterans' Services to distribute to the Navajo Nation for costs associated with improvements to the Fort Defiance Veterans Memorial Cemetery.

Primary Sponsor(s): Sen. Jamescita Peshlakai, D-Dist. 7

Major Actions: 22 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Appropriations and Rules Committees.

[SB 1182 Lukachukai veterans' multipurpose complex; appropriation](#)

Appropriates \$500,000 from the State General Fund in FY21 to the Arizona Department of Veterans' Services to distribute to the Navajo Nation for costs associated with planning, designing and constructing the Lukachukai Veterans' Multipurpose Complex.

Primary Sponsor(s): Sen. Jamescita Peshlakai, D-Dist. 7

Major Actions: 22 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Appropriations and Rules Committees.

[SB 1185 tribal nations; veterans' services; appropriation](#)

Appropriates \$2,200,000 and 20 FTE positions from the State General Fund in FY21 to the Arizona Department of Veterans' Services to hire veteran service officers to provide services in rural tribal nations in this state that have communities that are located 100 miles or more from the nearest United States Department of Veterans Affairs Service Center. Contains a legislative intent clause that the monies appropriated for this purpose be collected and identified from revenues collected on Indian reservations in this state.

Major Actions: 22 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Appropriations, Finance and Rules Committees.

[SB 1187 Native American veterans; tax settlement](#)

Extends the amount of time that the monies in the Veterans' Income Tax Settlement Fund revert back to the State General Fund from June 30, 2021 to June 30, 2023 and the amount of time that Arizona Department of Veterans' Services will accept applications from December 31, 2019 to December 31, 2021.

Major Actions: 22 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Finance and Rules Committees. **Scheduled to be heard in the Senate Finance Committee on 19 Feb 2020.**

[SB 1212 board licensure; certification; residents](#)

Specifies that a person who is a resident of this state or who is a military spouse married to an active duty member and who is accompanying the member on official orders and who are seeking occupational licensing reciprocity in this state must have met the minimum education requirements and if applicable, work experience and clinical supervision requirements in the other state that were in place at the time the person was licensed or certified. Further clarifies that a person's licensure or certification by another state is proof that the person met the education requirements and, if applicable, work experience and clinical supervision requirement in effect in that state at the time of the licensure or certification.

Major Actions: 23 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Health & Human Services and Rules Committees. **Scheduled to be heard in Senate Health & Human Services Committee on 20 Feb 2020.**

SB 1237 veterans; income tax subtraction; increase

Increases the maximum subtraction from Arizona gross income for veteran benefits, annuities and pensions from \$3500 to the full pension amount for taxable years beginning from and after December 31, 2019. Contains a retroactive date of January 1, 2020.

Major Actions: 23 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Appropriations and Rules Committees. 4 Feb 2020- Received a "Do Pass" recommendation from the Senate Appropriations Committee with a vote of 8-1-0-0. 10 Feb 2020- Passed Senate Rules. **11 Feb 2020- Passed Senate Democrat and Republican Caucus.**

SB 1238 recorder's fees; military discharge documents

Requires a county recorder to record without fee the discharge papers of National Guard members.

Adopted Committee Amendment

Adds an Emergency Clause.

Major Actions: 23 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Government and Rules Committees. 3 Feb 2020- Received a "Do Pass as Amended" from the Senate Government Committee with a vote of 7-0-0-0. 10 Feb 2020- Passed Senate Rules. 11 Feb 2020- Passed Senate Democrat and Republican Caucus. 13 Feb 2020- Received a "Do Pass Recommendation" from the Senate Committee of the Whole. **13 Feb 2020- Passed House Third Read with a vote of 30-0-0-0. Transmitted to the House.**

SB 1245 military justice; technical correction

Makes a technical correction.

Primary Sponsor(s): Sen. David Gowan, R-Dist. 14

Major Actions: 23 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Rules Committees.

SB 1311 special plates; optional personal information

Requires that the application form for a special license plate must allow a person to opt out of allowing ADOT to share the applicant's name and contact information with an entity that receives donation monies from the issuance or renewal of the special plate. Specifies that if a person does not opt out, ADOT must provide the person's name and contact information to each entity that receives donation monies from the issuance or renewal of the special plate.

Major Actions: 28 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Transportation & Public Safety and Rules Committees.

SB 1391 smoking regulation; electronic smoking devices

Makes several changes to the Smoke-Free Arizona Act including removing the exemption that allows smoking in veterans and fraternal clubs when they are not open to the general public.

Primary Sponsor(s): Sen. Heather Carter, R-Dist. 15

Major Actions: 29 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Commerce and Rules Committees.

SB 1394 unclaimed property; housing trust fund

Stipulates that 55% of the proceeds from the sale of abandoned property must be deposited in the Housing Trust Fund.

NOTE: Currently the first \$2,000,000 of proceeds collected from abandoned property are deposited into the SMI housing trust fund, the second \$2,000,000 is transferred to the Housing Trust Fund and the next \$24,500,000 are deposited into the Department of Revenue Administrative Fund.

Major Actions: 29 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Appropriations and Rules Committees. Scheduled to be heard in the Senate Appropriations Committee on 18 Feb 2020.

SB 1501 smoking regulation; electronic smoking devices

Makes several changes to the Smoke-Free Arizona Act including removing the exemption that allows smoking in veterans and fraternal clubs when they are not open to the general public.

Subject to a "same subject" Strike-Everything amendment.

Primary Sponsor(s): Sen. Heather Carter, R-Dist. 15

Major Actions: 03 Feb 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Commerce and Rules Committees. Scheduled to be heard in the Senate Commerce Committee on 20 Feb 2020.

SB 1523 mental health omnibus

Expands youth access to behavioral health services in schools with an \$8 million appropriation, establishes a Suicide Mortality Review Team, and ensures insurance plans offered in Arizona comply with existing federal mental health parity laws. Among other members, the Suicide Mortality Review Team must include a representative of a veterans' organization or military family advocacy program.

Primary Sponsor(s): Sen. Kate Brophy-McGee, R-Dist. 28

Major Actions: 3 Feb 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Health & Human Services, Appropriations and Rules Committees. **Scheduled to be heard in the Senate Health & Human Services Committee on 19 Feb 2020.**

SB 1575 property tax exemptions; statutory conformity

Conditional on the voter approval of S.C.R. 1043, exempts, from property tax, the property of veterans with service or nonservice-connected disabilities who are Arizona residents.

Adopted Committee Amendment

Inserts the correlating resolution for the conditional enactment.

Major Actions: 04 Feb 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Finance and Rules Committees. **12 Feb 2020- Received a “Do Pass as Amended” from the Senate Finance Committee with a vote of 10-0-0-0. Scheduled for Senate Rules on 17 Feb 2020.**

SB1594 military installation fund; property; conveyance

Allows the Department of Emergency and Military Affairs (DEMA) to sell, lease or convey property, infrastructure or improvements acquired for the preservation or enhancement of military installations.

Adopted Committee Amendment

Requires DEMA to ensure acquired property that is subsequently conveyed to another entity is used or developed in compliance with high noise and accident potential zone development standards and specifies that DEMA does not need to determine if property is not needed for the purposes of preserving or enhancing military installations before the property can be conveyed.

Major Actions: 5 Feb 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Transportation & Public Safety and Rules Committees. **12 Feb 2020- Received a “Do Pass as Amended” with a vote of 7-0-1-0. Scheduled for Senate Rules on 17 Feb 2020.**

SB 1662 military family relief fund; grants

Stipulates that if the Military Family Relief Fund (MFRF) subaccounts have a balance of at least \$2M at the beginning of the fiscal year, the Director of ADVS may allocate up to \$500,000 each fiscal year in grants of not more than \$150,000 for each grant to veteran service organizations that are qualified pursuant 501(c)(19) of the internal revenue code to provide veterans benefits service officers to assist veterans in obtaining benefits and services. Additionally, the bill would require the Director to adopt rules to implement this new process.

Major Actions: 05 Feb 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Transportation & Public Safety and Rules Committees.

[SCR 1043 constitutional property tax exemptions](#)

Subject to voter approval, amends the Constitution of Arizona to repeal sections relating to property tax exemptions and replaces the sections with one consolidated property tax exemption section.

Primary Sponsor(s): Sen. JD Mesnard, R-Dist. 17

Major Actions: 04 Feb 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Finance and Rules Committees. 12 Feb 2020- Received a “Do Pass” recommendation from the Senate Finance Committee with a vote of 10-0-0.

House Bills

[HB 2035 appropriation; veterans services; benefits counselors](#)

Appropriates \$1.2 million from the State General Fund, in addition to any other appropriations made in FY21, to the Arizona Department of Veterans’ Services to hire additional benefits counselors.

Primary Sponsor(s): Rep. Richard Andrade, D-Dist. 29, et al.

Major Actions: 21 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the House Military & Veterans Affairs, Appropriations and Rules Committees.

[HB 2086 tuition waiver; military; veterans; family](#)

Provides tuition waivers to spouses and dependents of veterans, National Guard members, former National Guard members and active military who meet certain criteria as well as veterans with a disability rating of 70% or higher. Certain stipulations apply that are outlined in the bill.

Primary Sponsor(s): Rep. Walter Blackman, R-Dist. 6

Major Actions:

[HB 2090 wind energy; siting](#)

Beginning on October 1, 2020, prohibits the construction or operation of a proposed individual wind turbine or any other individual structure that requires a federal aviation administration form 7460-1 and that is part of a wind energy facility from encroaching on or otherwise having a significant adverse impact on the mission, training or operations of any military installation or branch of military as determined by the military aviation and installation assurance siting clearinghouse and the federal aviation administration.

Major Actions: 13 Jan 2020- First Read and Assigned to the House Natural Resources Energy & Water and Rules Committees. 21 Jan 2020- Received a “Do Pass” from the House Natural Resources Energy & Water Committee with a vote of 10-1-0-2. 27 Jan 2020- Passed House Rules. 28 Jan 2020- Passed House Majority and Minority Caucus.

[HB 2096 security guard registration; discharged veterans](#)

Allows for a veteran who is honorably discharged from the United States military to receive a 30-day security guard registration certificate or a 30 day armed security guard registration certificate before the required background screenings for the applicant are complete.

[Adopted Committee Amendment](#)

Extends the time of the certification from 30 to 45 days and states that the veteran must have been honorably discharged not more than three years before application.

[Adopted Substitute Floor Amendment](#)

Allows a veteran who receives a 45-day security guard certificate to work only for the agency licensee that provides the required preassignment training and includes language from the committee amendment.

[HB2135 veteran suicides; annual report](#)

Adds that the report on veteran suicides in this state provided by the Arizona Department of Health Services must include utilization and encounter data for a nonprofit veterans’ services organization that provides services related to reducing suicides among this state’s military and veteran populations.

Primary Sponsor(s): Rep. Jay Lawrence, R-Dist. 23

Major Actions: 13 Jan 2020 - First Read and assigned to the House Military & Veterans Affairs and Rules Committees. 27 Jan 2020- Received a “Do Pass” from the House Military and Veterans Affairs Committee with a vote of 7-0-0-0. 3 Feb 2020- Passed House Rules Committee. 4 Feb 2020- Passed Minority and Majority Caucus. **6 Feb 2020- Passed House Third Read with a vote of 60-0-0-0. Transmitted to the Senate.**

[HB 2138 common law marriage confirmation; caregivers](#)

Establishes common law between two individuals when certain criteria are met when two persons live together in partnership at the time of the death of one of the persons. The surviving person must provide evidence to the clerk of the Superior Court that shows all of the following:

- The two persons are the biological or adoptive parents of one or more children together;
- The two persons have lived together in partnership for at least two consecutive years; and
- The surviving person acted as a caregiver to the deceased person while the persons lived together in partnership.

Contains a retroactive date of September 1, 2017.

Scheduled for House Rules on 17 Feb 2020.

Major Actions: 29 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the House Judiciary and Rules Committees. **Scheduled to be heard in the House Judiciary Committee on 19 Feb 2020.**

[HB 2139 appropriation; veterans’ services; benefits counselors](#)

Appropriates \$1.2 million from the State General Fund, in addition to any other appropriations made in FY21, to the Arizona Department of Veterans’ Services to hire additional benefits counselors.

[Adopted Appropriations Amendment](#)

Reduces the appropriation from \$1.2 million to \$416,400.

Primary Sponsor(s): Rep. Jay Lawrence, R-Dist. 23

Major Actions: 21 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the House Military & Veterans Affairs, Appropriations and Rules Committees. 27 Jan 2020- Received a “Do Pass” from the House Military and Veterans Affairs Committee with a vote of 7-0-0-0. 12 Feb 2020- Received a “Do Pass as Amended” recommendation from the House Appropriations Committee with a vote of 10-0-0-1. Scheduled for House Rules on 17 Feb 2020.

[HB 2141 universities; community colleges; constitutions; instruction](#)

Requires each university and community college in this state to offer a course of instruction on the constitutions of the United States and Arizona with a credit value of at least 6 semester hours. Prohibits a university or community college from granting a degree to any person who has not completed and earned credit for the course of instruction described above. Allows a university or community college to grant up to 3 semester hours of credit toward satisfaction of this requirement for substantially equivalent work completed by the student in the program of an approved senior reserve officer training corps unit. Applies an exemption of this requirement for a degree granted on completion of an academic program offered by a medical and dental unit of a university or community college to a student who is a member of the Armed Forces of the United States, including the Reserves or National Guard if certain criteria are met.

[HB 2173 smoking regulation; electronic smoking devices](#)

Makes several changes to the Smoke-Free Arizona Act including removing the exemption that allows smoking in veterans and fraternal clubs when they are not open to the general public.

Primary Sponsor(s): Rep. John Kavanagh, R-Dist. 23

Major Actions: 16 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the House Health & Human Services and Rules Committee.

[HB 2175 occupational licensure; certification; requirements; residents](#)

Adds that a military spouse or person who establishes residence in this state and who is seeking licensing reciprocity in this state must also have been continuously licensed or certified and practicing for at least six months in another state before applying in this state, must be in compliance with the licensing or certifying state’s continuing education requirements and must attest at the time of applying that the person has not had discipline imposed by any other regulating entity.

Major Actions:

[HB 2183 funeral escorts; funeral board licensure](#)

In addition to other provisions pertaining to military escort vehicles, requires the Board of Funeral Directors and Embalmers to license funeral escort vehicles and drivers and military escort vehicles and drivers in a manner as prescribed by the Board by Rule. Additionally, the bill requires the Board to issue a license to a driver of a military escort vehicle only if the applicant is affiliated with a nonprofit organization that provides military processions and meets the other requirements as prescribed by the Board.

NOTE: This bill is similar but not identical to [HB2694](#) which was discussed but held in the House Transportation Committee during the 2019 Legislative Session.

[HB 2184 occupational and professional licensure; notice](#)

SB 1211 administrative rules; expiration; legislative extension

Repeals all administrative rules on July 1, 2022, unless extended by an agency through the statutory rulemaking process. Repeals the Arizona Administrative Code (AAC) each year, beginning July 1, 2023, unless continued by the Legislature for up to one year.

SB 1219 government information technology projects; responsibility

Requires the Arizona Department of Administration, rather than budget units, to directly contract with third parties to review and guide budget unit information technology project proposals above \$5,000,000.

SB1220 state agencies; technology plans; deadline

Requires budget units to submit information technology plans to the Arizona Department of Administration by May 15, rather than September 1, of each year.

SB 1388 telecommuting; alternative schedules; state employees

Requires the Director of the Department of Administration to establish a comprehensive statewide telecommuting and alternative work schedule policy under which eligible state employees, as determine by their respective state agency, ay telecommute or participate in alternative work schedules.

Primary Sponsor(s): Sen. Juan Mendez, D-Dist. 26

Major Actions: 29 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the Senate Government and Rules Committees.

SB 1664 civil liability; gun free zones

Holds a government entity that establishes a gun-free zone liable for any damages claimed by a person who was harmed by criminal conduct in the gun-free zone if a reasonable person would believe that possession of a firearm could have helped the person defend against the criminal conduct.

Adopted Committee Amendment

Removes the allows for the court to award treble damages to a person who is harmed in a gun-free zone established by a government entity if certain criteria is met. Makes a conforming change to the definition of “gun-free zone”.

HB 2053 executive sessions; security plans

Adds the discussion of security related issues of buildings and technology to the list of allowable purposes to hold an executive session.

Major Actions: 13 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the House Technology, Government and Rules Committees. 22 Jan 2020- Received a “Do Pass” recommendation from the House Technology Committee with a vote of 7-0-0-0. 30 Jan 2020- Received a “Do Pass” recommendation from the House Government Committee with a vote of 11-0-0-0.

HB 2113 ASRS; employer; member; contributions

Requires the Arizona State Retirement System (ASRS) to provide employers with an employer credit against future contributions if more than the correct amount of employer or member contribution is paid into ASRS through a mistake of fact or mistake of law. Specifies that ASRS may not pay an employer earnings attributable to the excess contributions, but must reduce the amount returned to an employer by the amount of losses attributable. Stipulates that on receipt of an employer credit or check the employer must return any member portion of the returned contributions to the member.

HB 2115 JLAC; auditor general

Makes various changes to statutes relating to the Auditor General and the Joint Legislative Audit Committee (JLAC) that include the following:

- Instructs all officers in any state agency, board, commission, department, institution, program, advisory council, committee, political subdivision and contractors with the state to afford reasonable and needed facilities for the Auditor General and make records available in the form at the time prescribed.
- Specifies that the Attorney General must supervise the prosecution of offenders refusing or failing to provide access and examination of records.
- Makes knowingly obstructing or misleading the Auditor General a class 2 misdemeanor.
- Requires the Auditor General to conduct or cause to be conducted financial and compliance audits of state agencies in compliance to the federal single audit requirement annually instead of every other year.
- Revises factors in determining the need for continuation or termination of an agency during sunset review reports.
- Modifies information provided by the agency in the final sunset review report.
- Allows the Auditor General or their authorized representatives access to employees in the performance of official duties.

HB 2116 bereavement leave; death of child

Requires an employer to allow an eligible employee to use up to a total of two weeks unpaid bereavement leave during any 12 month period for purposes of attending the funeral or burial service of the eligible employee's child, making any arrangements resulting from the death of the eligible employee's child, or grieving the death of the eligible employee's child. Stipulates that if more than one child of an eligible employee dies within a 12-month period, the employer must allow the eligible employee to use up to a total of six work weeks of unpaid bereavement leave during any 12-month period. Allows an eligible employee to use other forms of paid leave concurrently with any unpaid bereavement leave taken. Defines "eligible employee" as an employee who meets the employment eligibility requirements under the Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA) and "employer" as an employer that is required to comply with the FMLA.

HB 2190 state employees; paid family leave

Requires that a state employee, whether within or exempt from the State Personnel System, be granted six weeks of paid leave per fiscal year for the birth of the employee's child or placement of a child with the employee in connection with foster care or adoption.

Primary Sponsor(s): Rep. Jennifer Jermaine, D-Dist. 18

HB 2251 public employees; travel reimbursement; airfare

Specifies that when a public official or public employee must travel in their official capacity by airplane, reimbursement for airfare may not exceed the cost of coach airfare and may not include any upgrades such as business class or first class seating. Specifies that only public officials and public employees are eligible for reimbursement by a public entity.

HB 2260 health facilities; resuscitation; emergency care

Requires health care institutions, including skilled nursing facilities, to do the following:

- Provide basic life support, including initiating immediate resuscitation, before the arrival of emergency medical services to a resident who experiences cardiac arrest or any other cessation of respiration in accordance with that resident's advance directives or a do-not-resuscitate order for that resident.
 - Stipulates that facility staff who are certified in CPR must be available at the facility at all times.
- Provide recovery assistance to noninjured residents who have fallen and are unable to reasonably recover themselves independently.
 - Stipulates that facility staff who are certified in fall recovery must be available at all times.

Prohibits the health care institution from establishing or implementing policies that prevent employees from providing immediate resuscitation, emergency care or fall recovery assistance to their patients or residents.

HB 2261 budget units; encumbrance documents; exception

Clarifies that certain expenditures under current law are exempt from the requirements of encumbrance documents.

Major Actions: 29 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the House Government and Rules Committees. **06 Feb 2020- Received a “Do Pass” recommendation from the House Government Committee with a vote of 11-0-0-0. Scheduled for House Rules on 17 Feb 2020.**

HB 2529 nonretaliation policies; health care institutions

Specifies that a health care institution or any of its third-party contractors is prohibited from retaliatory actions against a health professional for making a report.

Scheduled for House Rules on 17 Feb 2020.**

HB 2538 health care workers; assault; prevention

- States that it is aggravated assault if a person commits an assault knowing or having reason to know that the victim is a health care worker while engaged in the health care worker’s duties and makes it a class 5 felony if the assault involves a physical injury.
- Requires health care employers to develop, implement and maintain a written workplace violence prevention plan that must be available at all times to all health care workers and contractors.
- Requires health care employers to investigate a workplace violence incident as soon as practicable and review the circumstances of the incident, solicit input from all of those involved, and document the findings, recommendations and corrective measures taken for each investigation conducted.
- Requires health care employers to provide training and education to its health care workers who may be exposed to workplace violence.

HB 2713 agency actions; procedures; fee awards

Makes various changes regarding the awarding of fees and other expenses against the state, city, town or county. Makes various administrative procedural changes regarding licensees and licensing decisions made by an agency.

Major Actions: 28 Jan 2020- First Read and assigned to the House Regulatory Affairs and Rules Committees. 03 Feb 2020- Received a “Do Pass” recommendation from the House Regulatory Affairs Committee with a vote of 4-3-0-0. 10 Feb 2020- Passed House Rules. 11 Feb 2020- Passed House Majority and Minority Caucus. Scheduled for House Third Read on 17 Feb 2020.

[HB 2890 government vehicles; electric; appropriation](#)

Requires all state agencies and political subdivisions to consider electric vehicles and the long-term maintenance and fuel costs in evaluating total costs over the life of the motor vehicle in considering the purchase of new motor vehicles. Appropriates \$1,000,000 from the State General Fund to the Department of Administration to distribute to political subdivisions for electric vehicle reimbursement.

Major Actions: 12 Feb 2020- First Read and assigned to the House Government, Appropriations and Rules Committees.
